C3medical is proud to be in close partnership with the Institut Curie, in charge of welcoming and taking care of all its international patients, all along their treatment.

Founded in 1909 by Marie Curie - the first woman to be awarded by a Nobel Prize and also, twice winner - and Dr. Claudius Régaud, it was the first cancer hospital in the world to merge on the same site, scientists with a medical team. Today's logo, with 2 imbricated circles, reminds this unique savoir-faire.

This revolutionary innovation led to the invention of radio-therapy in 1920, introduction of chemotherapy in the 50's, of proton-therapy in 1991, of immune-therapy in 2018 alongside of latest techniques such as precision medicine, AI (artificial intelligence) and DNA use. In its centennial history, the Institut Curie has been awarded with 6 Nobel Prizes.

Today, the Institut Curie is still a private non-profit foundation, focusing on fighting against cancer by operating both an hospital and a research center on biophysics, cell biology and oncology (see <https://institut-curie.org/>).

Every year, the Institut Curie is welcoming more than 50 000 patients a year, from all around the world, thanks to 76 different nationalities working together in a total of a world-class team of 2,500+ medical and 1,000+ research personnel.

The Institut Curie is intensively partnering with leading specialized hospitals (ex. cardio-thoracic surgery with IMM/Institut Mutualiste Montsouris, Necker-Enfants Malades Hospital for children's surgery), national and international professional cancer associations (ex.
